E- Bee Finalists



The E-Bee contest was more like a marathon - or a spell-a-thon - with the finalists spelling an unprecedented 176 words in 24 rounds! Just for comparison, the final contest in the last years averaged around 100 words in 11 rounds. For the first time ever in the history of the American Library Spelling Bee the judges had to make use of back-up word lists. The E-Bees kept the audience on the edge of their seats, out-spelling each other round after round. By round 16, the group had dwindled to three strong spellers going another five rounds together. Aaryan K. claimed third place by spelling out in round 21. After another three rounds, Dharini P. clinched first place with Jeron Lysander S. coming in formidably in second place.

The Bee: How it Worked

Participating spellers were divided into two groups:

- **E-Bees** (students taught primarily in English)
- Bees (students taught primarily in a language other than English, e.g., students from German schools or in non-English sections of international schools).

This year 106 students from 15 different schools took part. The age range was 7 to 16 with a median age of 12.

Each group was provided with a 200-word list to study.

A written test was administered at the library and in some schools in March. Twenty words were chosen from the respective lists — plus ten bonus words not from the lists. We had one perfect score all 30 words spelled correctly! 18 students spelled all 20 on-list words correctly!

The top 40 students were invited to participate in the oral final contest at the American Library. Well done!
